
- 4-The Problem of Imbalance of the Iraqi Economy Structure:

6-Problem of Unemployment beside around (4) million Official whom work in Governmental Sector which need around(50%) from the budget as operation cost








#### - Exhibit ES - 1: INES Strategy Evaluation Dimensions




- Exhibit ES - 2: Linkage between Iraqi Oil Production and Prosperity




#### -Exhibit ES - 3: Iraq's Oil Reserves



#### -Exhibit ES - 4: Alternative Oil Production Profiles




#### -Exhibit ES - 5: Crude Oil Evacuation Infrastructure

## Exhibit ES - 7: Potential Export of Surplus Gas





Exhibit ES - 8: Planned Expansion of Iraq's Generation Capacity
